2011-2012 Student Ambassador Program

Engage with global issues. Gain leadership skills. Become an Ambassador of the World Affairs Council in your community! This program gives high school and college students the opportunity to dive into world issues through research, discussion, outreach and action, while also serving as student leaders at World Affairs Council education programs. Ambassadors will deepen their own knowledge by researching critical global issues and working in groups to find effective ways to address these issues. Students who successfully complete the program will receive a one year membership to the World Affairs Council. There are two ways to participate in the program:

As a **Student Ambassador**, you serve for one academic year and attend meetings at the Council twice a month. By engaging in service, education and advocacy, you will be able to translate your passion and ideas into action. Selected Student Ambassadors will have the opportunity to participate in the WorldAffairs 2012 Take Action Event at the Annual Conference. Additionally, Ambassadors gain access to the Council's public programming and are expected to attend at least two events each semester. Meetings begin October 6 and are held on Thursdays from 5:30 to 7:30 PM. A provisional calendar is attached.

Group Leaders serve as Ambassadors, but also have additional opportunities to sharpen their leadership skills by attending leadership meetings and taking on additional responsibilities, such as facilitating discussions and organizing Global Issue Groups. Past participants in the Ambassador Program, Summer Institute or Annual Conference Policy Simulation who are at least juniors in high school are eligible to apply for the leadership program. Leadership meetings are held once a month. The first leadership meeting will be held on Thursday, September 29 from 5:30 to 6:30 PM.
